All of these ladies have consented to serve and we want to thank them for that willingness. Our TFRW State President, Barbara Trautman, will be swearing them in as your new officers at our December meeting.

### Montgomery County Republican Women to Purchase Commemorative Brick

Sue Ellen Yates and Gail Longton shared at the last meeting the plans by the Clarksville-Montgomery County Arts and Heritage Development Council for the Tennessee Triumph statue to be placed in Public Square in downtown Clarksville on August 15, 2020. More information will follow as we get closer to this event.

The club unanimously voted that we should purchase a 8"x 8" brick for \$200 that will have 6 lines of 20 characters inscribed on it showing the MCRW support for the suffrage movement.

### **Membership Dues Increase**

Marie Tillman and Willi Frank reported that during the NFRW Biennial Convention, there was a bylaws vote which increased the NFRW membership dues from \$10 to \$20 per year starting in 2020. As a result, MCRW members discussed several options as to how we could absorb this \$10.00 increase that will be paid to the NFRW.

It was unanimously decided by vote that the yearly dues for membership in our club will increase to \$35.00 per year instead of the \$25.00. Our Associate dues will increase to \$20.00 and we encourage everyone to get their "significant others" to become associate members since this is totally all income for us.

The NFRW is currently working on making this transition to the website database. In order to make this process go smoothly and allow all changes to be implemented, 2020 membership dues will be able to be entered into the database **beginning January 1, 2020**. Whenever you pay your dues in November or December, they will be held and paid on the 1st Quarter 2020 report.

We are no longer taking dues for 2019. Any dues that you pay from today on, will be for 2020. Our dues are now \$35.00 per year! Men may join as Associate Members for \$20.00 per year. ### Little Red Hen

Page 96

- 3 pounds boneless, skinless chicken thighs
- 1 green pepper, chopped
- 1 onion, chopped
- 1 (10-3/4 ounce) can tomato soup
- 1/4 cup cider vinegar

- 2 tablespoons brown sugar
- 1 teaspoon black pepper
- 1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
- 1/2 cup sliced mushrooms or more, to taste

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Place chicken pieces in an open baking dish. Combine green pepper, onion, tomato soup, vinegar, brown sugar, pepper, Worcestershire sauce and mushrooms; pour over chicken. Bake uncovered for 1 hour and 15 minutes.

Note: This is our family favorite and is great with brown rice and salad.
