



Three eager members, what will they do? One got discouraged and then there were *two*.


Two earnest members, each enrolled one more. Doubling their number, then there were four.

There were several ladies and Associates of MCRWC who rode the bus and witnessed the festivities for the swearing in of the new Representatives in this 110th General Assembly. During that ceremony, our own Curtis Johnson was once again sworn in as the Speaker Pro Tempore, Beth Harwell returned to the Speaker of the House position, and Senator Randy McNally of Oak Ridge, was sworn in as Tennessee's 87th Speaker of

the Senate, serving as the Lt. Governor, filling the position vacated by Ron Ramsey's retirement.

After witnessing the swearing in, the group was directed to Beth Harwell's Library, where Curtis and Jay, along with Mark Green provided lunch for the group.

Everyone enjoyed the fellowship and the festivities and ceremonies of the day and returned home with a feeling of joy and pride for being a part of the Tennessee Republican Party.

Elder Abuse Legislation

" Our club participated in a telephone hotline, e-mail and/ or letter writing campaign to promote GOP legislation at the local, state or national level."

In order to complete this requirement toward the NFRW Diamond Award, we consulted State Representative Jay Reedy to get his idea of something that we might help get passed in our State Legislature. Representative Reedy brought to our attention HB 410 that he introduced last year as follows:

"AN ACT to amend Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 39, Chapter 17, Part 3 and Title 71, Chapter 6, relative to offenses committed against the elderly. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GEN-ERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 39-17-315, is amended by deleting subdivision (c)(1)(B) and substituting instead the following:

(B) (i) The victim of the offense was less than eighteen (18) years of age at any time during the person's course of conduct, and the person is five (5) or more years older than the victim; or

(ii) The victim of the offense was sixty-five (65) years of age or older at any time during the person's course of conduct, and the person is five (5) or more years younger than the victim.

SECTION 2. This act shall take

effect July 1, 2015, the public welfare requiring it."
