and the University of Memphis School of Law, she practiced law in Memphis for three years. In 2006, she had the opportunity to move home to Clarksville to join Batson Nolan law firm. In January 2013, she became a Member/Owner of the firm. While at Batson Nolan, her law practice was primarily in defense of civil suits, with an emphasis in governmental liability, employment law, and business litigation. Her clients

included governmental officials and employees, law enforcement officers, businesses, and the Clarksville-Montgomery County School System.

In 2018, Katy was selected by Governor Bill Haslam to serve as Circuit Court Judge for the 19th Judicial District, which is comprised of Robertson and Montgomery Counties.

Outside of her professional life, Katy is very active in the community and her church. She and her husband Aaron have two great kids

Erinne Hester, Republican Candidate for Assessor of Property is also scheduled to speak to us at our January meeting. She is running unopposed in the March 3, 2020 primary for another term.

Erinne was appointed to the position of Assessor in December 2013, and won the general elections in 2014 and 2016. As Assessor, Erinne and her team have the constitutional

mandate to list, classify, and value all real and personal property in Montgomery County.

Erinne began her employment with Montgomery County Government in 2005 and was appointed to Director of Accounts and Budgets in 2008. She also served as the Director of EMS Billing from 2009-2010. Erinne is also a member of the Mont-

gomery County Republican Women Club.

#### PRESIDENTIAL PREFERENCE AND COUNTY PRIMARY (REPUBLICAN & DEMOCRATIC)

TUESDAY, MARCH 3, 2020 Taken from the Montgomery County Election Commission website

The following offices will be on the ballot. Offices with districts indicated are elected by voters living in those specific districts.

In order to vote in this election, you must choose which Party Primary (Republican or Democratic) you wish to vote in. The State of Tennessee is an open primary state, meaning a registered voter must declare their political party preference in order to vote in a primary.

#### PRESIDENTIAL PREFERENCE PRIMARY

- Presidential Candidates (Republican and Democratic) TERM 4 yrs
- Delegate Candidates (Republican only)

#### **COUNTY PRIMARY**

- Circuit Court Judge Part V (to fill unexpired term)
   TERM 8 yrs
- Assessor of Property TERM 4 yrs
- Highway Supervisor TERM 4 yrs



#### Early Voting—February 12 – 25, 2020

All registered voters are eligible to vote early. No reason is required to vote early. Early voting is held at the Election Commission office. Early voting begins the twentieth day and ends the fifth

day before Election Day. This includes Saturdays and extended weekday hours.

#### Voter Registration Deadline - February 3, 2020

This is the registration deadline for the March 3, 2020 election. Persons not currently registered to vote in Montgomery County must do so by this date.

There are several places to register to vote:

#### In Person

- Election Commission office Montgomery County Veterans Plaza, 350 Pageant Lane, Suite 404 Office hours Monday through Friday 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.
- State agencies: Department of Safety, Department of Human Services, Health Department, WIC office, Dept. of Veterans Affairs, and Dept. of Mental Health & Retardation

By-Mail (forms are available at the following locations)

- Local Post Offices
- Public Library
- County Clerk
- Register of Deeds
- Online printable form through the Tennessee State website, <a href="https://sos-tn-gov-files.s3.amazonaws.com/forms/ss-3010.pdf">https://sos-tn-gov-files.s3.amazonaws.com/forms/ss-3010.pdf</a>. Print application on white paper using black ink only.
- Register to vote online—anyone with a Driver's License or ID issued by the Tennessee Department of Safety and Homeland Security ID. To register, visit <a href="https://ovr.govote.tn.gov/">https://ovr.govote.tn.gov/</a> By-mail applicants must vote in-person the first time.

Note: All by-mail applications must be postmarked no later than 30 days before an election.

- You are not a registered voter until you receive your voter card.
- All persons who have moved their residence are required to change their registration records with this office or they will be purged/removed from the records.
- Voters are encouraged to make any changes or corrections to their voter registration record by the deadline. To change your name you are required to file a new registration form to update your signature.
- Note: If you are currently registered in another Tennessee county or in another state you must complete an application for voter registration for Montgomery County, Tennessee. Voter registration does not transfer between counties or states.
