


also from his district and the procedure is the same as for Jay's contacts.

From our Cookbook . . .

Eisenhower's Barbeque Sauce

1/4 cup butter
1 (20-ounce) can tomatoes, sieved to equal 2 cups

1/4 cup vinegar

1 tablespoon sugar

3 teaspoons paprika

1 small onion, finely chopped

2 teaspoons salt

2 teaspoons chili powder

1-1/2 teaspoons Worcestershire

sauce

1/4 teaspoon Tabasco sauce or more, according to taste

1 teaspoon black pepper

Mix butter, tomatoes, vinegar, sugar, paprika, onion, salt, chili powder, Worcestershire sauce, Tabasco sauce and pepper in stock pan. Simmer for about 15 minutes. Use for basting meat or chicken. Can also serve as sauce for meats as well. Makes enough for 5 pounds of meat/chicken.
